- Recognises the specific processes that indigenous leaders must follow, including consultation with their communities, and that this may take time when consulting on matters that are important to a community
- Supports indigenous communities with achieving an understanding of oil and gas exploration and production operations and the relevance of this in their local community
- Ensures our employees and contractors have appropriate cultural awareness training and understand their obligations with regard to the protection of cultural heritage sites
- Promotes diversity within our workforce to encourage new ideas and cultural perspectives and provides specific training opportunities to support skills development.
